Here's a simple checklist you can use to drastically reduce your property's risk.

| Clean and maintain gutters and roofs | Keep grass and weeds cut below 10 centimetres |
|--|---|
| Relocate propane, firewood and other fuel sources 10 to 30 metres away from structures | Prune trees to create a two-meter clearance from the ground to the lowest branches |
| Reduce the flammability of your landscaping and plant wildfire resistant vegetation | Clean under your deck to remove and combustible material. Establish a 1.5 metre non-combustible zone around the perimeter of the house and deck |

- Move firewood and propane 10 to 30 metres away from your home.
- Have a household wildfire evacuation plan.

The Home Rebate Program

As part of British Columbia's Community Resiliency Investment (CRI) program, there is potential for homeowners to be compensated for performing FireSmart activities on residential property or homes.

To qualify for this funding under the FireSmart Community Funding & Support rebate program within CRI, homes must be assessed by a certified Local FireSmart Representative or FireSmart Home Partners assessor.
